Position Summary

The Chamber Music Specialist oversees all activities of the chamber music program, culminating in approximately 15 concerts. The Chamber Music Specialist works closely with teaching artists, fellows, and Music Academy administration and reports to the Director of Artistic Operations. This is an excellent opportunity for those looking to explore a career in arts administration.

Position Responsibilities

- In advance of summer, attend remote meetings with Chamber Music Committee to develop fellow chamber assignments, repertoire selections, and rehearsal and coaching schedule
- Determine and manage room assignments for rehearsals in consultation with Artistic Operations Manager
- Oversee chamber rehearsal and coaching schedule with input from teaching artists and the Artistic Operations Manager
- Serve as the main contact for teaching artists, fellows, and administration for the chamber music program
- Work with the Marketing and Communications department to ensure that printed programs are accurate and proofed
- Coordinate with Production team all stage needs and set-ups, stage plots, etc., in advance of each chamber concert
- Assist with backstage concert duty and distribute run sheets for each chamber music concert
- Work with fellows directly to develop fellow-curated concerts, including managing the online request submission tool, proposing repertoire, and recruiting personnel
- Develop and implement Fellow Speaking Program for concert introductions
- Other duties as assigned

Compensation and Benefits

This is a seasonal, non-exempt, full-time position. Compensation is \$20 per hour, commensurate with skills and experience. Seasonal employees are not eligible for Music Academy benefits unless required by law. Housing and meals are included during the summer residency for those not based in the Santa Barbara area. Lunch is provided on the Miraflores campus Monday-Friday for those not on the residential meal plan. Complimentary tickets are offered when available.
