Position Description

The Lehrer Vocal Institute Coordinator supports the day-to-day operations of the Lehrer Vocal Institute (LVI). The Lehrer Vocal Institute Coordinator acts as the first point of contact and liaison between all voice and vocal piano fellows, Lehrer Vocal Institute teaching artists, mainstage opera staff, and visiting guest artists. This role is integral in maintaining the Institute's overall schedule. This position reports to the Lehrer Vocal Institute Director of Artistic Operations.

Position Responsibilities

Assist the Lehrer Vocal Institute Director of Artistic Operations (and other LVI Administration) with daily and seasonal operations including:

- Creation of programs, texts/translations, production run sheets, and other documentation for LVI public events (masterclasses, concerts, opera, Marilyn Horne Song Competition)
- Assist with backstage concert duty for LVI public events, including distribution of run sheets for each event
- Facilitate communication between Lehrer Vocal Institute fellows, teaching artists, and other Music Academy constituents
- Provide general office support for Lehrer Vocal Institute teaching artists and fellows
- Attend Lehrer Vocal Institute events as necessary
- Other duties as assigned

At the discretion of LVI Director of Artistic Operations and according to experience, "Other duties" may include:

- In coordination with the Lehrer Vocal Institute Director of Artistic Operations, oversee the master schedule for all Lehrer Vocal Institute events
- Create and manage schedules for rehearsals, performances, masterclasses, lessons, and coachings
- Manage and track teaching artists and fellow schedule change requests
- Assist in producing the annual Marilyn Horne Song Competition in coordination with the Vice President of Innovation and Program Development
- Run supertitles for the mainstage opera and/or other events

Professional Requirements

The Music Academy of the West seeks to hire candidates who thrive in a collaborative, highly communicative workplace. - Strong critical thinking, strategic planning, and problem-solving skills
- Superior organizational skills and attention to detail
- Ability to work on a team and adapt to changing work priorities
- Positive and professional demeanor
- Previous summer festival experience

Additional Requirements

- Some nights and weekends are required, including concert duty.
- Frequent travel between Music Academy's Miraflores campus, Westmont Campus, and offsite venues

Compensation and Benefits

This is a seasonal, non-exempt, full-time position. Compensation is \$18 per hour, commensurate with skills and experience. Seasonal employees are not eligible for Music Academy benefits. Housing and meals are included during the employment period.
