Position Description

The Video Production Associate plays a pivotal role in the Music Academy's video production department during the Music Academy Summer Festival. This position reports to the Manager of Production and Technology and collaborates with Music Academy administration, teaching artists, guest artists, and fellows. This position offers valuable hands-on experience and an opportunity to develop their video production experience in an environment with intensive performance activity.

Position Responsibilities

- Manage the video recording of Music Academy concerts in Hahn Hall, utilizing a PTZ-based camera recording system
- Manage the setup and video recording in venues on the Miraflores campus and other public performance venues off-site, utilizing a camcorder-based recording system
- Manage the organization, editing, archiving, and distribution processes of media
- Other video-related production duties as assigned

Candidate Profile

- Proficiency in Microsoft Office and Google Workspace; experience with ArtsVision a plus
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Strong critical thinking, strategic planning, and problem-solving abilities

- Superior organizational skills with keen attention to detail
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team, adapting to shifting priorities as needed
- Positive, professional demeanor, especially in high-pressure environments
- Previous summer festival experience is a plus
- Local candidate preferred

Additional Requirements

- Most nights and weekends are required, including concert duty
- Frequent travel between Music Academy's Miraflores campus and off-site venues

Compensation and Benefits

This is a seasonal, non-exempt, full-time position. Compensation is \$19 per hour, commensurate with skills and experience. Seasonal employees are not eligible for Music Academy benefits unless required by law. Lunch is provided Monday-Friday. Complimentary tickets are offered when available.
